*Full-time teaching staff members were assigned to the Core Section (the Cultural Sciences, Human Sciences, and the Natural and Applied Sciences Divisions) and the Advanced Interdisciplinary Research Section of the Graduate School of Humanities and Sciences, and engage in university-wide operation of graduate schools and undergraduate studies. Accordingly, because the number of full-time teaching staff members is not assigned to individual faculties and graduate schools, the total number of students is divided by the number of full-time teaching staff members. The University has 192 full-time teaching staff members. (B)
